Turcology Turkic Studies (Double Degree, UU and JGU) Linguistics: Study focus Turcology World Literature: Study focus Turkish Literature

- Teaching language in the M.A. Turcology and the M.A. Turkic Studies is English.
- In the Linguistics and World Literature programmes, teaching language of all non-Turcological components is usually German.

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The M.A. Turkic Studies is a double Master's degree programme by the Universities of Uppsala and Mainz (UU and JGU).

Upon successful completion of the programme, students obtain two Master's degree certificates, one from UU and one from JGU.

The study focus of the programme is the linguistic and philological research of the Turkic languages.

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Structure of the M.A. Turkic Studies

- The first two terms are completed at UU (Sweden)
- The last two terms are completed at JGU (Germany)
- The M.A. thesis is jointly supervised by one advisor of UU and one advisor of JGU



Content of the M.A. Turkic Studies:

- Old and Middle Turkic philology
- History and typology of the Turkic languages
- Structure of Oghuz, Kipchak and Siberian Turkic
- Linguistic theory and research methodology
- Literature and culture



Final Module:

- M.A. thesis (6 months)
- Colloquium
- Oral examination (30 Minuten)

Terms of admission

- BA in Turcology, Turkic languages or another field directly related to Turkic Studies.
- At the time of admission students have to hold an issued degree certificate.
- Good active and passive proficiency in Turkish or another Turkic language corresponding to at least B2 according to CEFR.
- Advanced active and passive proficiency in English.

A maximum of 15 students per year will be accepted. The degree programme begins only in the fall term (UU) / winter semester (JGU).

The application, administration of the selection process and the admission of prospective students is conducted by Uppsala University.
